A Note from Pastor Grant Fishbook LEAD TEACHING PASTOR



ransparent moment: *I don't like election years*. My reason? Civility seems to go out the window as we choose who will lead our country.

For the next eleven months, you and I are going to be inundated with brochures, mailers, commercials, debates, candidate profiles, mudslinging, accusations, promises, hopes and fears... all for the express purpose of swaying our minds — and our votes — toward a specific political platform.

So, this year, I'm going to try and get out ahead of the mayhem! I am going to call our church to a higher ideal... the platform of Jesus.

Jesus didn't have a political platform. He had an eternal platform. Jesus didn't come to build a government. He was building an eternal kingdom. Jesus stood in the face of incivility and called people to a better way.

How did he do it? He challenged the cultural assertions with simple words: "You have heard it said...but I say to you."

Don't get me wrong. I believe that government is important. I believe your voice is important. But I believe that the Kingdom of God is more important than anything!

So, what if we could do this year differently? What if we could act differently and become an inspiration instead of just another voice in the angry crowd? What if we could join the Prince of Peace, in his mission, and call people into a better way? What if we could actually choose to live under the gracious rule and reign of Jesus?

Here is my promise: I am not going to tell you what to think. I would love to allow Jesus to show us how to think. In doing that, maybe we could honor God and each other in our love, hope, differences, and humanity. This could get interesting!

A Note from Pastor Melonie Kemp LEAD EXECUTIVE PASTOR



ne of our five stated values here at CTK is simplicity, which can be defined many different ways. At CTK we choose to live out the value of simplicity in a very specific way: we choose the least complicated approach to our beliefs, decision-making, ministry processes, language, and engaging people. We will not make access to truth, knowledge, leading or serving difficult.

What that often means is that we choose not to use overtly academic or insider language or create complicated processes

when it comes to communicating about how we live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I recently attended a training that was all about missiology (big academic word). I was so struck by how important it is to intentionally choose how we will engage the current and future culture with the transformational message of the Gospel. This will require ways that are simple and accessible, coming from a place that tears down walls versus hiding within them.

Missiology happens at the intersection of the Gospel, culture and the church. It is saying yes, as the church, to the act of being sent to the culture, on behalf of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Missiology is how my theology is practically lived out. Will I choose to get to know my neighbor? Will I seek to understand someone who is very different from me? Will I cross religious, ethnic, and other cultural barriers to show compassion to someone I would rarely engage with because of the way my life is structured?

In the story of the good Samaritan, Jesus teaches us that love is more than a feeling or an abstract idea. It's an action that can be risky. Loving this way will cost us something. It may cost us money, time, comfort, or control. But this is the Gospel in action.

My challenge for you this season is to get to know one person who is different from you. Learn their name and something about their life. Be kind. Be curious. Show compassion. Then watch and see what Jesus does through his Church! Blessings to you!

Spiritual Health Self Assessment

Your assessment results will show if you're sitting, crawling, walking or running in each of these four areas. Armed with that information, you can begin to pursue steps forward. In the fall, winter and spring editions of CTK Life, classes, groups and workshops map directly to the four areas above and indicate which stage of growth they're best suited to.




Other giving options include online bill pay through your financial institution, or with planned giving through stocks, real estate, retirement assets, and life insurance.

CTK Hosts Severe Weather Shelter

Sharing What We Have is the Right Thing to Do



Hosting the Severe Weather Shelter is a collaborative effort of staff and volunteers from CTK Bellingham, CTK Downtown, and Ekklesia.

THE ISSUES OF HOMELESSNESS AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING have come front and center for our community in the last several years. Many agencies and nonprofits work to address these issues but their finite resources are being stretched thinner and thinner. Much of the community's debate is around who should step in, who can help, who should pay for the kinds of services that are needed to rebuild lives.

We know that we cannot meet every need or fill every gap, but after thoughtful discussion and much prayer, we believe God is showing us what we can do—open Norway Hall as a place for people experiencing homelessness to get in out of the cold this winter.

On nights when the temperature falls below 28° and the Lighthouse Mission and the Winter Overflow Shelter have reached capacity, we will provide a warm place for 50 men to sleep. When we have been blessed with so much, Christ makes it very clear that sharing what we have is the right thing to do.

Here are the ways you can help:

- 1. **Pray** for our volunteers, for our guests, for their interactions, and that peace would reign in that space each time we open.
- 2. **Give** financially. Despite our best planning efforts, we underestimated the cost of hosting a shelter like this. To make sure your giving gets to the right place, use a green CTK Blessing envelope or choose Blessing if you give online.

Although, an overnight shelter is something we've never done before, our learning for this type of ministry began in February 2019 when we began hosting the Lighthouse Mission's shower trailer every Friday. Over the last year, we've learned a lot about how to build trust and create relationship with people experiencing homelessness, even as we endeavor to be wise and empowering in our interactions.


