- How does "therefore" connect this section to the previous section we just discussed?
- How does worry connect to what we consider wealth or treasure?
- How is the command "don't worry" hard for you to follow, especially in times like this?
- Jesus asked who could add a single hour to their life by worrying.
 How have you wasted an hour on worry?
- How does Jesus compare God's concern for us versus the rest of creation? How do you think/feel about that? What can we learn from the birds and flowers?
- How are we to respond to worry different than the "pagans" Jesus mentioned?
- Reread verse 33. What does this verse really mean? How is this such a significant verse to combat our worries?
- It has been said "our worry about tomorrow robs the joy we can have today." How so?
- What worry do you need to turn into prayer right now?
