Today's Truth: Love is doing what has already been done.

Matthew 22:35–40 (NIV)

 $\Rightarrow$  Jesus makes it clear that all the commandments on love.

John 13:34-35 (NIV)

This Week's Spiritual Practice: Create a Love in Action Plan

Share Together: Author Gary Chapman describes 5 types of love languages: Gifts, quality time, words of affirmation, acts of service, physical affection. Which do you prefer to receive? Which one do you prefer to give? How

do you find this a challenge in receiving and giving love?

**Reflect Together**: What impacted you the most from Sunday's message, and how were you able to apply this week's spiritual practice?

Read Together: Matthew 22:34-40

Discuss Together:

- Why do you think the religious leaders were testing Jesus with this question, "What is the greatest commandment? What do you think their motive was?
- How have you seen people get hung up on the technicalities of laws over the intent of them?
- Why do you think Jesus responded the way He did? What was He conveying?
- How is there tension in strict obedience versus embracing God's grace?
- Read John 13:34-35. How does love sum up the law, similar to what he said to his disciples? How are we to love according to Jesus?
- How does our love prove we are one of His? Why is this so critical to the mission of Jesus?
- How does our love for God and others guide us in fulfilling what God calls us to do and be?
- What would happen if we obeyed the "law of love" in our marriages, our family, our church and our community?
- In what way are you personally challenged to love in a situation you are currently facing, for which you could use God's help with wisdom and courage?
