Two Big Questions (taken from PROAPT):

What is it saying about God?

What is it saying about me? Who? How? Why?

1. The Pharisees try to trap Jesus into making a political statement that will upset one group of people. What do you notice about how they tried to set Jesus up?
2. Jesus calls them out for not asking an honest question. What was their real intent in asking Jesus this question?
3. What is your primary takeaway from Jesus' response to the Pharisees?
4. What does Jesus' response tell us about how we engage our government and society?
5. When Jesus says 'Give to God what is God's'...what does He mean?
6. What does passage teach us about the power we're supposed to put our hope in?
7. How does putting our hope in God change the way we address the world's problems? Or even our own problems?
8. Does this passage challenge or comfort you? Why?
